In the winter our pillows froze to the inside of the caravan, it was that cold!

Me: In the week that Danielle was leaving to go back to NZ, I was on a Zoom meeting with the Sailor's Society, and they announced that all their worldwide port related chaplaincy would now come to an end. Helping seafarers would now only be done by going online. So, myself and many other chaplains would lose our jobs and no longer be able to work in our ports. For a number of reasons, you cannot operate in many ports without being under the umbrella of a recognised mission. But.. God hadn't finished with this ministry and where one door shut another opened!

# **Ministry to the Seafarers**

In July 2022, a Christian charity called QVSR, took over the running of five seafarer centres, including Portbury Seafarer Centre where I am based. QVSR, stands for 'Queen Victoria Seamen's Rest.' They provide accommodation in London for retired seafarers and others who need a place to stay.

As did Sailor's Society before; QVSR provide the open door in the port in order for me to share the love of God with the seafarer's I meet. Counties, equally continue to give support so that I can fulfil my calling.

I also want to voice my gratitude to the Counties family who responded with love and support when I received notice of my redundancy. They immediately turned to the Lord in prayer and stood with me as we prayed for what God might do with this change of events. It didn't take long before I was able to share with them how God had wonderfully answered our prayers. In all of this, I never missed a day at the port and was encouraged by hearing how many in the port were pleased that I wasn't going anywhere!

And to confirm that the Lord is very much in this ministry, I have had a number of wonderful conversations with seafarers recently about the Good News of the Gospel. An Egyptian captain was very excited to talk with me about my faith. I gave him an Arabic bible and a 'Why Jesus' booklet.
